Overview of the assignment:

The impact assessment is to find out to which extent the intended impacts at farmers' household level had been achieved. Past and ongoing trends and dynamics in the agrarian sector and especially on land and the inheritance law within Uganda shall also be analysed as current and future enablers or obstacles in the perspective to adjust projects future approaches. While the small-scale farmer's household level will be the major focus of the impact study, the effects on women and youth as well as on households with little land or no land shall be also be considered. Additionally, out-phased households from the 2nd edition of the impact study shall be covered by qualitative ex-post analysis to better understand in how far project interventions had influenced these households after completion of the project support. Findings will be compared with previous studies to better understand changes and further developments in Uganda's peasantry. A team of 2 consultants (we suggest including 1 Ugandan) is requested. A group of local enumerators will be trained, and after two supervised pre-tests, supervised by the Ugandan Consultant.

- Applications for participation should be submitted in the form of a short formal letter. Please enclose a current CV with fee rate as well as a list of references, including comparable assignments that have already been completed
- If necessary, the bidder may also commission third parties with the performance of the services or parts of the services. If subcontractors are intended to be engaged by the bidder(s), this must already be stated in the application. The eligibility of subcontractors must be demonstrated.

Eligibility criteria

Applicants are invited to present two CVs, one expert should ideally be Ugandan (resident). Applications must meet the following eligibility criteria to be invited to submit a bid:

- Experienced agronomist, agro-economist or (rural) sociologist
- proven experiences in conducting quantitative household studies as well as qualitative data collection,
- familiarity with farming systems and rural livelihood systems in Sub-Saharan Africa and substantial working experiences in Sub-Saharan Africa and especially Uganda
- practical and theoretical knowledge on land tenure systems and land fragmentation in Africa,
- experience in conducting quantitative and qualitative empirical studies,
- familiarity with farming systems and rural livelihood systems in Sub-Saharan Africa
